Mayor Cox discussed the Dispatch Consolidation Update, New City Hall/Police Department Hours, Approval of items discussed in closed session on July 3, 2024, Reading of Obituary- In Memory of Russell L. VanWasshenova, and Request to waive – Community Center Rental Fee

Mayor Cox stated that they met with Gibraltar Police Chief, Gibraltar Fire Chief and the IT personnel and they have a live test date scheduled for July 22, 2024. He was just informed today that the phone lines have already been run for the 911 transfers. We transferred our weather siren over to Flat Rock and they will be handling that now. Gross Ile has agreed to handle our 911 overflow calls. We are set to have a smooth transition.

Council Member Joaquin asked about the technology here, video call box, updating the sign on the drop box etc.

Mayor Cox stated that those are things that we have talked about implementing. We also have our IT guy, Jake, pricing out cameras for the front lobby and side door of City Hall and those will be able to be viewed by Gibraltar as well.

Mayor Cox announced the passing of former Police Chief Russell Leon VanWasshenova.

Russell Leon VanWasshenova, age 68 of South Rockwood, passed away July 6, 2024. Born in Monroe, Russell was the son of Harold and Betty (LeFeve) Van Wasshenova. A graduate of Airport High School, he continued his education at Washtenaw Community College. Russell married the love of his life, Emily McNabb, in 1982. He dedicated his career to Law Enforcement, working for the Village of South Rockwood and then for the City of Rockwood, retiring with the rank of Chief of Police. Russell also was one of the founders of the Downriver Rescue Dive and Recovery Team as well as having developed software for Police Departments. He enjoyed scuba diving, hunting and snowmobiling, but his most treasured times were those spent with his family.

Russell leaves to cherish his memory, Emily, his wife of the past 42 years; 4 children: Jessica (David) Millerwise, Russell (Shawna) VanWasshenova, Jillian (Ben) Shearer and Sarah (Scott) Ferrier; as well as 15 grandchildren and 2 siblings: Harold VanWasshenova and Mary Jo (Greg) Hounshell. Sadly, he was preceded in death by his parents and 2 siblings: Janet Dusseau and Theresa Serpetti.

A Funeral Mass will be held at a later date.

Mayor Cox went on to say that Russell started his career in 1979 and was promoted to Chief of Police for the City of Rockwood in 1999 and he retired in 2010. Mayor Cox wanted to thank Russell for his dedicated service to the community.

Mayor Cox stated that the audit starts on July 22, 2024. Please be patient with Administrator Trush during this time as she will be very busy.

Mayor Cox stated that he just received an update from Director Boron that they will be laying an inch more of asphalt on the bike path in Mercure Park. We have been waiting on this for a long time.

Council Member Joaquin asked if the park would be closed for this.

Director Boron stated that it will not be.

Mayor Cox stated that Director Boron looked at the City Welcome Sign and removed one of the advertisement signs that are on it, and you can see right through it now. Mayor Cox does not think we need to move the sign at all now.

Mayor Cox stated that he also addressed the water ring issue that one of the residents was complaining about. He spoke with other community department heads and no one else seems to be having this problem. He is waiting on a call back from GLWA. Another thing to take into consideration is that the pipes are 10 years older now and the water running through it may be washing some minerals out.

Council Member Mercure stated that she also did some research and she read also that it could be minerals flushing through the pipes. She also stated that she did not know this but, you should clean the inside of your toilet tank periodically and that should help.
